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### **"SID THE SCIENCE KID DAY" AT THE CALIFORNIA SCIENCE CENTER -- FREE EVENT FOR LITTLE SCIENTISTS TO EXPLORE, INVESTIGATE AND DISCOVER**

LOS ANGELES (August 23, 2010) – **SID THE SCIENCE KID™**, the award-winning PBS KIDS® television series produced by The Jim Henson Company and KCET/Los Angeles, is coming to the California Science Center on Sunday, September 26 to encourage Little Scientists of all ages to observe, explore and investigate with a hands-on visit. - **Compare and Contrast.** In the Curator's Lab, Little Scientists will learn how kelp is different from plants, and how brine shrimp is different from other tiny sea creatures.
- **Observe.** Guests can watch a dive show in the giant kelp tank, and ask questions about how the divers interact with the creatures in the kelp forest.
- **Predict.** At the Stream Table in the River Zone, children can see how water flows in a river and over the land, and predict where it will go next – just like Sid and his pals in one of this season's episodes!

Kids and parents will also be able to catch sneak-peek screenings of “Sid’s Super Kick,” a new episode of **SID THE SCIENCE KID™** in both English and Spanish, featuring live-action segments filmed at the California Science Center’s Big Lab.
